GLOBE ANNOUNCES NEW BOARD MEMBERS

San Diego – The Tony Award-winning Globe Theatres is pleased to announce several new members of its Board of Directors, elected by the Globe's membership at the Annual Meeting in February.

Joining the Board for new three-year terms are **Sheryl White** and **Evelyn Mack Truitt**. In addition to the new members, **Susan Major** and **Sam Brown** were each re-elected to a second three-year term on the Board. Also at the meeting, former Board President and major Globe supporter **Harvey P. White** was named Honorary Chairman. At a supplemental meeting, the Board elected two additional members, **Richard V. McCune** and **Tom Sayles**, who will each join for three-year terms.

The 2003 officers include **Sister Sally Furay, RSCJ**, who has been appointed the Board's new Treasurer, and **Sheryl White**, who has been appointed Secretary. **Paul I. Sheryl White has had numerous roles over the years at the Globe. In addition to being a long-time supporter, Sheryl has previously served two terms on the Globe's board and most recently served as the Chair of the 2002 Globe Gala, a role she also played in 2000. **Evelyn Mack Truitt** returns to the Globe board this year, after having served on the Board for two consecutive terms from 1995-1998 and 1999-2001. Truitt's additional involvement with the theatre includes production sponsorship for *Springtime for Henry* in 1997 and *Paramour* in 1998, among others.

Richard McCune is the Senior Vice President at City National Bank, Entertainment Division – Relationship Manager. He has also served as Vice President for Entertainment Lending at Mercantile National Bank and as Vice President – Branch Manager at Bank of Los Angeles. From 1991 to 1997, McCune served on the Board (as Chairman, Treasurer and Finance Committee Member) of the AIDS Healthcare Foundation, Los Angeles. He also was a Member of the Friends of the HIV Community and a member of the Finance committee of the Hollywood Chamber of Commerce.

Thomas S. Sayles is Vice President of Governmental and Community Affairs for Sempra Energy. He previously served as the company's Senior Vice President of Consumer Marketing for Sempra Energy Solutions. Prior to that, Sayles was Vice President of Public Affairs for Pacific Enterprises, the former parent company of SoCalGas. He was also a co-founder of Qualcomm Incorporated, a pioneer in wireless communications. Mr. White has been a resident of San Diego County since 1972 and has been involved in a number of community organizations. Additionally, he and his wife, Sheryl, also provide philanthropic support to many organizations. In addition to the Globe, his current board affiliations locally include, among others, Applied Micro Circuits Corporation (AMCC), the San Diego Regional Economic Development Corporation (EDC), WIDCOMM, Incl., and The San Diego Padres. He also serves as a trustee on the Board of West Virginia Wesleyan College and The American Indian College Fund, among other activities.

The 40-member volunteer Board of Directors oversees all business affairs of the Globe, and assists the theatre in achieving its artistic mission and financial goals.
